CLASSIFICATIONS

Please check the film rating for the films you plan to attend and do not bring younger children to films rated as 15+.

HIFF organisers have signposted the films not rated by BBFC, with an age suitability rating based on content. This is intended as a guideline only.

BBFC CLASSIFICATIONS



U – Universal

Suitable for all. A U film should be suitable for audiences aged four years and over, although it is impossible to predict what might upset any particular child. U films should be set within a positive framework and should offer reassuring counterbalances to any violence, threat or horror.



PG – Parental Guidance

General viewing, but some scenes may be unsuitable for young children. A PG film should not unsettle a child around eight or older. Unaccompanied children of any age may watch, but parents are advised to consider whether the content may upset younger, or more sensitive, children.



12A

Films classified 12A contain material that is not generally suitable for children aged under 12. No one younger than 12 may see a 12 A film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult. Adults planning to take a child under 12 to view a 12A film should consider whether the film is suitable for that child. Suitable only for 15 years and over, no one younger than 15 may see a 15 film in a cinema. No one younger than 15 may rent or buy a 15 rated video work. Films may contain strong language, violence or short scenes of a sexual nature.

Artifishal is a film about people, rivers, and the fight for the future of wild fish and the environment that supports them. It explores wild salmon's slide towards extinction, threats posed by fish hatcheries and fish farms, and our continued loss of faith in nature. Salmon have long been an icon of the wild, but in our rush to meet demand and mask the larger root environmental issues, we've forgotten the true value of wild. Ultimately the film sets two ideologies at odds, those who embrace the power of nature to heal and those who believe in a world that requires continued control. The film leaves viewers wrestling with a disquieting question, have we reached the end of wild?

The Pullars are the last family to use traditional fishing methods for their farming of wild Atlantic salmon off the north west coast of Scotland. When these fishing methods include killing seals, the salmon's natural predators, conflict erupts. Animal activist groups Sea Shepherd and Hunt Saboteurs oppose the Pullars at every turn. Challenging preconceptions, This documentary puts modern environmentalism under the microscope.

She must confront hostile neighbours, remain profitable and much more, making use of her courage, creativity, and strength of character to do so. The Biggest Little Farm

A testament to the immense complexity of nature, The Biggest Little Farm follows two dreamers and a dog on an odyssey to bring harmony to both their lives and the land. When the barking of their beloved dog Todd leads to an eviction notice from their tiny LA apartment, John and Molly Chester make a choice that takes them out of the city and onto 200 acres in the foothills of Ventura County, naively endeavoring to build one of the most diverse farms of its kind in complete coexistence with nature. The land they've chosen, however, is utterly depleted of nutrients and suffering from a brutal drought. The film chronicles eight years of daunting work and outsize idealism as they attempt to create the utopia they seek, planting 10,000 orchard trees and over 200 different crops, and bringing in animals of every kind.

Anthropocene explores through stunning but striking images the ever-increasing and drastic way in which humans are shaping our planet. The film traverses the globe from Kenya, where mounds of illegal elephant tusks are set alight, to colossal mining operations in Russia and Germany, and gaudy evaporation pools in Chile's Atacama Desert. De Pencier's epic cinematography and Alicia Vikander's narration capture the immense power and terrible beauty of our endeavours.

On the banks of Loch Earn lies the tiny Perthshire Village of St Fillans. 2017 marked the Bicentenary of its re-naming and the whole village, with customary enthusiasm, came together to celebrate. This is the story of the village and its changing fortunes. Archivist Jim Brierly takes us with him on a journey through time; from the Picts and the arrival of St Fillan himself, the early farming communities on the hillside, the Clearances, the foundation of the Highland Society, the arrival of the Railway and the two World Wars. It is a story of endurance and of how adversity shapes and determines the survival of a community, reflecting the challenges facing all our rural communities in Scotland today.

manager of the fishery board on Sutherland's River Helmsdale.

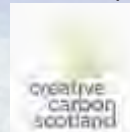

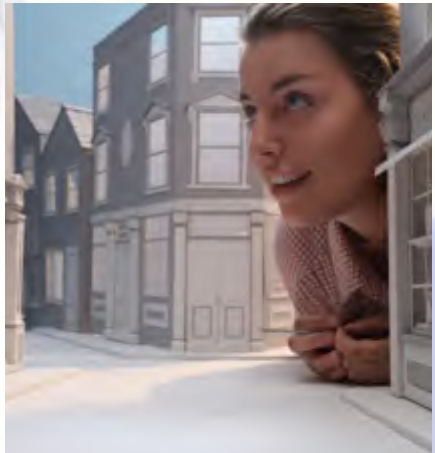
